

Our Expectations

- Independence In Year 6, we encourage independence in preparation for secondary school.
- Morning Work This will begin at 8:45 each morning and children would benefit by being in school for this time.
- Appearance Full school uniform is expected and for PE, the children are expected to wear plain navy bottoms and a plain white t-shirt.
- Equipment We provide most of the equipment for the children, such as handwriting pens, pencils, rulers and rubbers, however due to current circumstances, to avoid sharing equipment, we ask that you send the children back to school with a pencil case (small enough to fit into their drawer).

- . Prime Minister




The Curriculum



- The children will take part in daily English and maths lessons, with a specific arithmetic and reading lesson each week.
- We will publish the termly overview on Bridgewater's website, identifying more specific learning.

Homework

- Homework Weekly English and maths homework will be set on Seesaw. This will be assigned on each Thursday and is expected to be completed by the following Tuesday.
- Times Tables and Reading As well as weekly English and maths homework, the children are also expected to complete regular times tables practise on TT Rockstars and read regularly at home to an adult.
- Spelling Shed Children will be able to access spelling activities to support them with the application of spelling rules they have been taught.

Transition

Pupil Premium Funding



The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England. Anyone who qualifies will receive a £45 voucher towards school uniform.

Your child may be eligible for Pupil Premium if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits.

- Income Support
- Income based job seekers allowance
- Child Tax credit
- Employment and support allowance (income related)
- Universal credit (income dependant)

Pupil Premium funding is paid directly to the school to improve the quality of your child's education experience.
