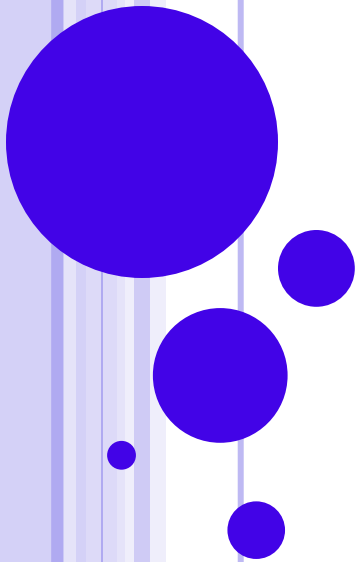

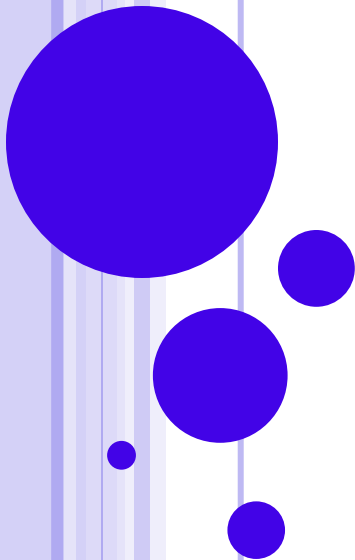

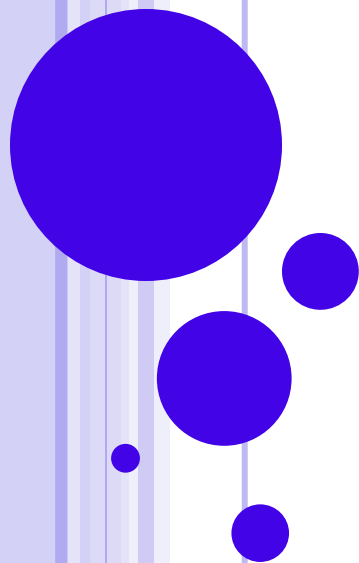




Year 5 Standards and Expectations

- Have pride in presentation and give maximum effort in learning.



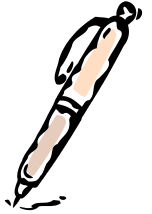

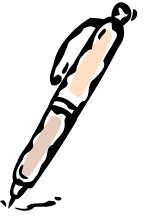

Preparing for September

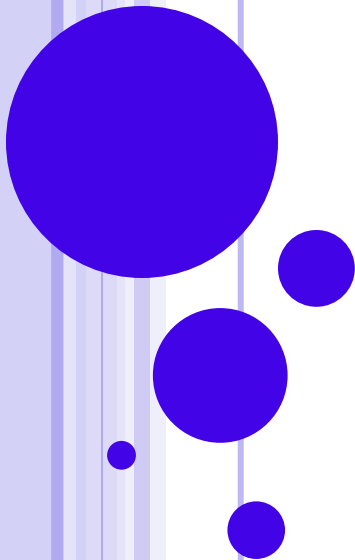
- Name labels in uniform and PE kit.

Attendance



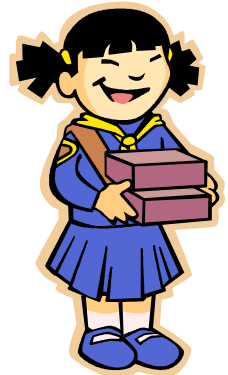
- Doors open at **8:45am** and morning work begins. This is an important time where we focus on reading, SPaG, maths and work that needs finishing.

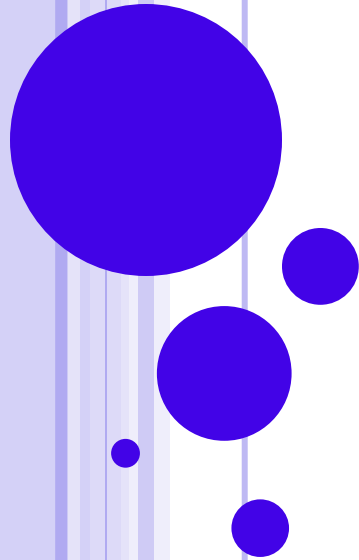

In the first term, our writing will link to our Ancient Greece unit in History.



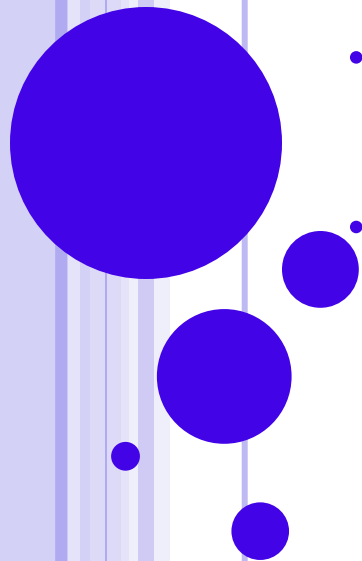
Reading



- Library sessions and books (library day will be informed in September).
- Each teacher will read a class book to their class every day.
- We aim to develop a culture of 'reading for pleasure'.
- Your child will have allocated reading levels and specific reading skills to focus on.
- It is expected that your child reads at home regularly. We would advise at least three times a week. **Could you please make an entry on Boom Reader to say your child has read with you.**

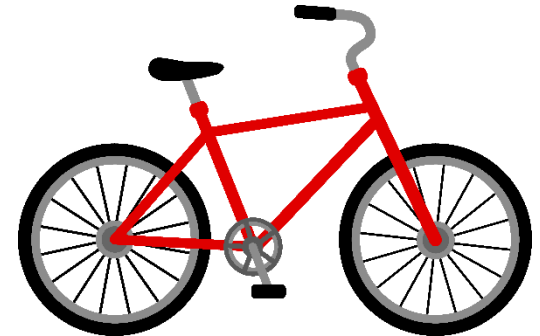
Home Learning

- The children will complete homework on Seesaw. This could be a variety of English, maths or any topic from the curriculum.
- Homework will be set weekly on a **Thursday** to be handed in on a **Tuesday** (children should take responsibility for this).
- Children will need to practise their spellings – these will also be on Seesaw and Spelling Shed.
- It is vital children can recall their times tables as it helps with every aspect of maths. TTRockstars should be used to help with this.

LOOKING AHEAD TO Y6 RESIDENTIAL
