




Year 3 Standards and Expectations

Year 3 Behaviour and Restorative Questions





Restorative Questions:

To resolve conflicts and behaviour issues:

- 1. What happened?
- 2. What were you thinking about at the time?
- 3. What have been your thoughts since?
- 4. Who has been affected?
- 5. What do you think you need to do to make things right?

Restorative approaches are used to help build positive relationships and encourage children to respect each other.

Home Learning



- A home learning task will set weekly, All children will be expected to complete these tasks. To start the year, we expect all children to be reading regularly and uploading books to Boom Reader. As the year progresses different tasks will be set either via Seesaw or in a Home-learning Journal.
- Children will need to continue to learn the Year 1 and 2 common exception words. These will be provided at the beginning of the year, then they will progress onto the Year 3 & 4 lists as appropriate.
- Children will continue have access to Times Tables Rock Stars, they should know x2, x5 and x10 from Year 2 and will learn x3, x4 and x8 in Year 3.





- Who is the author?
- What is an illustrator? What do they do?
- What do you think the book will be about? Why?
- What does this word mean? Can you read the words around it to help you figure it out? (Put the word in context?)
- Can you say the sounds, read the word?
- Who are the main characters?
- What do you think will happen next?
- How do you think that character feels? Why? How would you feel in that situation?
- Can you predict what will happen next?
- Where is the story set?
- Who is your favourite character? Why?
- Is there a hidden message in the story? What is it?
- Can you retell the story in your own words?
- What did you like/dislike about the story?
- Do you like how the story ended? Can you think of another way the book could have ended?
- Can you find the _____ sounds on this page?

Pupil Premium Funding



The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England. Anyone who qualifies will receive a £45 voucher towards school uniform.

Your child may be eligible for Pupil Premium if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits.

- Income Support
- Income based job seekers allowance
- Child Tax credit
- Employment and support allowance (income related)
- Universal credit (income dependant)

Pupil Premium funding is paid directly to the school to improve the quality of your child's education experience.
