



How are the British Values developed in Geography?

Democracy - Our children can explore and discuss injustices, inequalities, challenge, and can debate these through the exploration of geographical topics. They can explore and consider different opinions and how voices are heard. (Respect)

Rule of Law - Our children become familiar with their own surroundings and extend their interest, knowledge and understanding of contrasting localities in Britain, Europe and the wider world and begin to appreciate what rules and restrictions other places abide by. (Resilience)

Individual Liberty - Our children have freedom of expression in a safe space, whilst respecting others during contributions to class discussions and they are encouraged as much as possible to develop their independent learning skills to help take control of their own learning. (Responsibility)

Mutual respect - Our children learn to appreciate similarity and difference in the world around them, have empathy for the lives of others and respect for others' beliefs, attitudes and values. This includes respect for the landscapes and understanding of aspects such as change and climate. (Respect)
