






Year 3 Standards and Expectations

Year 3 Behaviour and Restorative Questions



Restorative Questions:



To resolve conflicts and behaviour issues:

1. What happened?
2. What were you thinking about at the time?
3. What have been your thoughts since?
4. Who has been affected?
5. What do you think you need to do to make things right?

Restorative approaches are used to help build positive relationships and encourage children to respect each other.

Behaviour Stages

Respect, Responsibility and Resilience	
Unexpected Behaviour	
Stage 1	<p>First warning Reminder of rules and expectations</p>
Stage 2	<p>Second Warning Reminder of rules and expectations Recorded</p>
Stage 3	<p>Third occurrence Moved to partner class and spoken to by Year Leader Recorded - write a commitment slip Inform: Parents/carers (phone call)</p>
Stage 4	<p>Continuing unexpected behaviour/ serious behaviour Spoken to by Phase Leader: Mrs Wise, Mrs Copeman or Mrs Redden. Recorded - review/ write commitment slip Inform: Parents/carers (phone call) and SLT.</p>
Stage 5	<p>Continuing unexpected behaviour/ sudden serious or unsafe behaviour. Spoken to by Mrs Harvey/ Headteacher or Mrs Troop/ Deputy Headteacher. Child phones parents/carers to explain. Recorded/SIMS if required as a prejudicial incident Inform: Child to parents/carers with SLT</p>
Stage 6	<p>ON RARE OCCASIONS Continuing unexpected behaviour/ sudden serious or unsafe behaviour. Possible suspension or exclusion Inform: Parents/carers by phone and follow-on letter</p>

Home Learning



- A home learning task will set weekly. All children will be expected to complete these tasks. To start the year, we expect all children to be reading regularly and uploading books to Boom Reader. As the year progresses different tasks will be set via Seesaw.
- Children will need to continue to learn the Year 1 and 2 common exception words. These will be provided at the beginning of the year, then they will progress onto the Year 3 & 4 lists as appropriate.
- Children will use Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS), they should know x2, x5 and x10 from Year 2 and will learn x3, x4 and x8 in Year 3.



- Regular whole class Book Talk and individual reading for pleasure.
- Families – please read with your children regularly at home and log **all** books on Boom Reader.





Supporting reading at home

- Look at the front cover. What could the book be about?
- Who is the author?
- What is an illustrator? What do they do?
- What do you think the book will be about? Why?
- What does this word mean? Can you read the words around it to help you figure it out? (Put the word in context?)
- Can you say the sounds, read the word?
- Who are the main characters?
- What do you think will happen next?
- How do you think that character feels? Why? How would you feel in that situation?
- Can you predict what will happen next?
- Where is the story set?
- Who is your favourite character? Why?
- Is there a hidden message in the story? What is it?
- Can you retell the story in your own words?
- What did you like/dislike about the story?
- Do you like how the story ended? Can you think of another way the book could have ended?
- Can you find the ____ sounds on this page?




Spanish Lessons

Pupil Premium Funding

The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England. Anyone who qualifies will receive a £35 voucher towards school uniform.

Your child may be eligible for Pupil Premium if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits.

- Income Support
- Income based job seekers allowance
- Child Tax credit
- Employment and support allowance (income related)
- Universal credit (income dependant)

Pupil Premium funding is paid directly to the school to improve the quality of your child's education experience.
